RESEARCH EDUCATE MOBILIZE

Our research, outreach, and campaigning work in 2021 was dominated by our response to major government proposals to remove regulation from many new genetically engineered foods and crops.



EDUCATION & OUTREACH

In 2021, CBAN built and ran a national campaign to counter corporate efforts to remove government safety assessments from new genetically engineered foods and seeds (genetically modified organisms or GMOs).

The goal of the campaign is to stop proposals that would remove government oversight over some GMOs and allow **corporate self-regulation** instead. In 2021, Health Canada and the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) both proposed to remove regulation from new gene-edited GMOs if they have no foreign DNA.

If the proposals are approved, corporations will be allowed to put many new GMOs on the market without any independent government safety checks and without even reporting these GMOs to the government. This would mean **unregulated**, **unknown GMOs** being grown and sold – increasing environmental and food safety risks, and resulting in a profound loss of transparency for consumers and farmers.

CBAN provided unique information and analysis to farmers and the general public about these proposals. We published guides to help



the public participate in both the Health Canada and CFIA **consultations**. We sent three detailed submissions to the departments, including a critique of Health Canada's scientific "primer" on gene editing.

We also met with officials in Health Canada and the CFIA, staff in the Minister of Health's office, and some Members of Parliament.

Media were slow to report on this issue but a National Farmers Union opinion article in the major farm paper *The Western Producer* referred farmers to CBAN's consultation guide for more information. This followed our own opinion piece.

Our work supported public engagement and increased the profile of concerns over genetic engineering and corporate lobbying, highlighted the failures of GM crops, and provided public education on the new genetic engineering techniques of gene editing.



At the end of 2021, we also provided a review of GMOs and various GM issues in Canada.




